





We Worship

Advent images of expectation, release, rest, and hope of salvation fill this hymn by Charles Wesley.

The hymn first appeared in a book of twenty-four hymns titled *Hymns for the Nativity of Our Lord* (1744). J.F. Lampe, a bassoonist at Covent Garden Theatre, where G.F. Handel's operas were performed, published it in 1746 in a collection titled *Festival Hymns*. This beloved advent hymn is a prayer to Christ to come and reign in our hearts, whereby we will find strength and consolation and the expectation of joining the reign of God. This hymn reflects both Old Testament prophecy of the Messiah and the New Testament birth of Christ, expressing the Advent themes of hope, love, joy, and peace.

During a year's sabbatical from his ministry at Holy Trinity Church in Philadelphia, author Phillips Brooks (1835-1893) rode to Bethlehem on horseback for Christmas Eve 1865. As a year that had seen the end of the American Civil War and the assassination of an American President drew to a close, Brooks' longing for peace found expression as he pondered the "everlasting light" that had shone in Bethlehem's "dark streets."

Once believed to have been composed by Martin Luther, its origin, text and tune have been traced by modern research to the United States of the nineteenth century. Although the text is of unknown origin, the tune AWAY IN A MANGER was composed by James R. Murray (1842-1905). At one time he taught music in the public schools of Andover, Massachusetts. He later served as an editor for a publisher of sacred music.

Spiritual Maturity & Application

Sunday's reading is Romans 13:11-14. N.T. Wright observes that in this scripture, "Paul expects his readers to be up before day breaks fully; this theme, with its echoes of the Easter morning stories, resonates through the early Christian sense of new creation, new life bursting through the wintry crust of the old world. It is, he insists, time to wake up."

Re-read this scripture as a prayer. Where is a place in your life that needs a wake up call? Identify your last wake up call. Did this wake up call lead to lasting change? What is God teaching you today? Journal, doodle, or discuss with friends.

In Matthew 24: 36-44 (see Monday) Jesus stresses the importance of watching vigilantly for his return. What does it mean to "keep awake"? Imagine yourself a sentry or a ship's deckhand standing a late night watch. What things might tempt you to drop your guard? Competing concerns? Fatigue? Distractions?

Spend some time thinking about how believing in Christ's return, and waiting expectantly for it, can help you live a stronger and more mature life.




