





#### We Worship

How do we name what we cannot see and touch? What do we call the Force that began the universe millions of years ago and yet who is as near as our last and next heartbeat? The Judeo-Christian tradition includes many names for God. Sometimes we have forgotten God's many names or have found one name so powerful that we used it exclusively. But God continues to reveal Godself to different people in different ways. And part of how that occurs is in images we know and understand - mother, father, youth, aged, hugging, working, planning, and wise. This text was written by Brian Wren in 1987 and uses a variety of names and images encompassing both genders and all ages.

## We Hear the Word

This is a lyrical wisdom psalm or greeting. The psalmist describes a situation that is considered rare and splendid. The Hebrew literally reads only that "people live together". The word translated "together" conveys some quality of harmony in life that warrants the designation "very good and pleasant." The anointing of oil refers to the generous and lavish use of precious oil with which a new chief priest is anointed from his beard and onto his vestments.

This prayer hymn comes from the GIA Catholic publication, Gather. It was written by Diana Kodner in the 1950's but was not published until 1994.





#### **Community Resolution of Respect**

## We Hear the Word

Cultural, ethnic, political, economic, and religious barriers and prejudices operate in this scene. The woman successfully challenges an excluding focus on Israel's covenant privilege to experience God's blessing and Jesus' commendation. Somewhere on the borders of Galilee and the predominantly Gentile cities of Tyre and Sidon, Jesus meets the unnamed woman, a Canaanite, the native inhabitants of the land displaced by Israel's occupation. Despite this long history of antagonism and her Gentile identity, she seeks Jesus' merciful help for her daughter. Jesus initially ignores her, claiming a mission only to Israel. With submissive and persistent action, she outwits Jesus, recognizing Israel's temporal priority in God's purposes but rejecting any exclusive focus. Food/• crumbs refer to God's realm or saving activity. Jesus identifies her persistence and dependence as faith. He heals her daughter. This event marks a change in

Jesus' ministry.

#### **Opening Essay**

#### Juxtaposing Layers of Differences, Struggles and Beauty

Us versus them: villains versus victims, rich versus poor, liberal versus conservative, black versus white, the West versus the rest. Labels. Labels. Labels.

The truth of the matter is that life it not neatly and tightly packaged into either-or-boxes. People are impossible to label, catalogue and shelve. Not even nations are politically homogeneous, not even families have members who are entirely identical or exactly opposite, not even tribes can duplicate members so that if you have met one Meru, you've met all Meru.

History itself it not monolithic. There is no coherent and clear grand narrative. Out there are real histories and realities quite unlike our own. What a terrifying thought it is; how it complicates living.

How do we survive juxtaposing our histories with the histories of people who are not like us and do not want to be like us? How do we live in a manner mindful of the layers of exploitation and struggles of different groups of people?

How do we live out as a body not just for some but for all of God's children? This can only be done by telling the whole story, the whole truth and nothing but the truth. It means allowing others to tell their stories and learning to listen to other people's stories.

#### Would Jesus Discriminate? (Part 2)

"Would Jesus Discriminate?" asks us to think about Jesus today, in a very different time and culture. Discrimination is a very modern concept. It is a word with many meanings, but the most common, in our culture, is the act of showing one's prejudice, particularly racial or gender or class prejudice: to disfavor someone

because of some perceived or even arbitrary characteristic.

A gay pastor was being ordained and wanted his father to participate. His father was a pastor in a conservative denomination and felt he had to ask the head of his denomination for permission to lay hands on his gay son in this more accepting church.

The denominational head was in the process of retiring, and he and his wife had moved into a new senior complex, next door to a gay male couple. Over time, his wife became friends with the men - with one, in particular. They went shopping together, met for lunch, and had coffee, and the neighbor was handy around the house in a way that the denominational executive was not.

When the denominational executive told his wife about the request from one of his pastors (to participate in the ordination of a gay son into a denomination that has a very different view of homosexuality than their own denomination), she became upset. She said, "Our neighbors are the two nicest men I have ever met; they are Christian in every sense of the word. I just don't understand what the big deal is and why the church believes and acts as it does!"

At that moment, the wall between assumptions or prejudices and what is true or real came tumbling down for that denominational executive; the permission requested was given to the pastor. This happened because the wife remembered that the Jesus she grew up with was about love and grace, about not just saying "Lord, Lord" but "doing the will" of the One who created us, about loving our neighbors - maybe even our gay neighbors.

We can only continue to hate and discriminate if we keep the "others" at a distance and don't see them as human, as part of someone's family, if not our own. If we can just label them "sinners" and can continue to not eat or drink or shop or work or go to church with them, we can continue to see them as a "threat" to us.

Jesus does not discriminate because he can't discriminate against his own. In the 25th chapter of Matthew's gospel, Jesus said we would always know how to find him: he lives today among the "least of these" - those who are discriminated against, hated, devalued, or abused - those who need food, clothing, shelter, or simply a visit - those who need justice, hope or understanding.


Jesus is with the gay teen who is mercilessly teased and bullied at school on a daily basis. Jesus suffers with lesbians and gay men in Jamaica who are attacked and beaten in their own homes by vigilantes. Jesus is with the undocumented worker who is threatened with deportation and having her family split apart. Jesus is with the parents who suffer silently in a church that condemns their son or daughter, and who agonize about their child's spirituality and safety. Jesus is with the child living with AIDS in Zimbabwe who cannot get lifesaving medications because of the expense.

In our heart of hearts, we know that Jesus was incapable of the kind of cruel discrimination that divides and harms. We also know that following him should cause us to care about our neighbors - all our neighbors - all the time.


#### **Unbinding the Gospel**
