The prelude is designed to set the tone for the worship service. It is also an offering from one of our gifted musicians. Many wish to listen and meditate during this time.

We Worship

Written in 1965 for Human Rights Day, (December 10), this hymn by Fred Kaan is his most widely published song. Perhaps that is because it suggests some practical ways to heal all of our nations.

It asks for God's justice to be applied in specific terms: A just and equal sharing of earth's resources; our commitment to acting out love, care, and goodness; the desire for abundant living for all; and a common quest for justice that gives us our pride in things we have been given and not earned such as status, race or schooling. It includes the churches, which must refrain from adherence to dogmas in the name of God, with the vision of God.

We Read the Word

In Moses' absence, the Israelites desire a golden calf in order to replace Moses as the leader of the Israelites in their wilderness journey.

Aaron molds a golden calf from their jewelry, breaking the command against images. We modern day followers of the Divine many times try to replace God with our own 'golden calf'. Yet in our worship of God we find that we need no other idol; whether it be money, addiction, self-praise or other things that destroy our journey to God.

We Worship

Rosa Martha Zarate Macias wrote this hymn for her Mexican People and other Pueblos deprived of their homeland, whom the Great Spirit calls to be prophets, men and women of courage, responsible for constructing the new society based in justice and love.

We Hear the Word

Paul concludes the main portion of the letter with a final call to rejoice, a series of general exhortations, and another reminder to imitate him.



Forty Years of Faith, Hope and Love!

A Home of Our Own— Faith-Based Continuing-Care Retirement Communities Designed Specifically for the Needs of LGBT Seniors, Families and Allies

As part of MCC's ministry on behalf of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender people, families and allies, the Board of Elders and Board of Administration have authorized the creation of a new not-for-profit organization, Metropolitan Communities, Inc.

This entity is commissioned to construct the first faith-based, continuing-care retirement community (CCRC) in the United States built exclusively by LGBT people of faith with specific programming for the needs of LGBT senior adults, families and allies.

"The immediate area includes easily accessible entertainment venues and will incorporate options for empowering educational and inclusive faith opportunities, convenient health and fitness centers, shopping, restaurants and health care."

During her installation homily at the National Cathedral in Washington, D.C., Moderator Rev. Elder Nancy Wilson announced MCC's commitment to a ten year focus on the human family and particularly those individuals who face discrimination in multiple ways—vulnerable children, people living with and affected by HIV and LGBT senior adults. *(continued on back)*


Metropolitan Communities, Inc. is addressing the issues confronting senior adults for these reasons:

- Seniors continue to face ageism and this challenge is often compounded by other forms of bias such as racism, homophobia, transphobia, AIDS phobia and gender inequality. Multiple forms of bias erode opportunities for exercising self-determination and receiving adequate care.
- The Area Agency on Aging and AARP have identified widespread discrimination originating in these forms of bias in long-term care facilities.

Affirmative Hillspoint (New York) is the exclusive partner of MCC in the acquisition and development of the first facility in Sarasota, Florida. Affirmative Hillspoint specializes in the development of market rate adult-living facilities, including full continuum life care communities.

The site plan approved for the proposed Sarasota facility is a mixed-use development, including a maximum of 324 residential dwelling units, multi-level parking and a maximum of 88,500 square feet of commercial space (office and retail). The preliminary construction plan calls for one and two bedroom units as well as several penthouse units with views of the Gulf of Mexico. The immediate area includes easily accessible entertainment venues and will incorporate options for empowering educational and inclusive faith opportunities, convenient health and fitness centers, shopping, restaurants and health care.

This ministry is made possible, in part, by the partnership in tithes invested by MCC churches—your churches. We hope that you will be inspired and your faith will be nourished hearing these stories of the life-changing work MCC is doing to say “no” to discrimination and “yes” to ministries of inclusion and justice. Thank you for giving so generously to your churches.




Forty Years and Today





Drumming Circle

From a distance, it may sound like music from a car stereo. But as you draw near, you realize that here is no melody, just a pulsating rhythm. Close inspection reveals a group of a dozen or so people playing drums of all kinds: big and little ones, both primitive and high-tech.

This is a drumming circle. These are gaining popularity across the country. Some celebrate Native American customs and heritage or other ethnic traditions, but all are outlets for people expressing a primal urge that drives their spirit, amidst camaraderie and fun.

A 2003 study, for example, found that drumming induces deep relaxation, lowers blood pressure, and reduces stress, which contributes to nearly all disease and is a primary cause of life-threatening illnesses. Drumming puts the mind, body and spirit in a place of rest.


