We Hear the Word

A primary theme in the book of Job is the question of why faithful people suffer in this life. The story of Job challenges the common misperception that faithful living somehow automatically protects us from disasters, sickness, and family misfortune in our earthly lives. The struggles of Job's friends in wrestling with this misperception extend for thirty-four chapters. These friends were certain that Job's dilemma was a consequence of sinfulness, for which he had not repented.

But even in his misery, Job defended his longstanding walk with God and insisted that his suffering was not a punishment from God for wrongdoing.

If you have ever wondered why suffering is part of our human experience, even when we are faithful servants of God, you'll find the questions and answers in the book of Job both challenging and comforting. And if difficulties seem to chip away at your faith through daily struggles, stand firm. Greater is God who is in you, than the accuser who is in the world.

¹ Then Job answered God: ² "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. ³ 'Who is obscuring my plans with such ignorant words?' you asked. That was me. I've been spouting off about things I can't understand, about wonders beyond my experience and my knowledge. ⁴ 'Listen now, and I will speak; I will ask the questions and you will answer me!' you said. ⁵ Formerly I knew you only by word of mouth, but now I see you with my own eyes. ⁶ And so I now take back all that I said, and repent in dust and ashes.

¹⁰ After Job has prayed for his friends, God restored Job's prosperity, blessing him with twice as much as he had before. ¹¹ Then all his sisters and brothers and everyone who had known him before visited Job and sat down and dined with him. They sympathized with him and comforted Job for all the suffering God had heaped upon him. Each of them gave Job a piece of silver and a gold ring.

¹² God blessed Job's latter days even more than his former life: he came to own 14,000 sheep, 6,000 camels, 1,000 yoke of oxen, and 1,000 donkeys. ¹³ He also went on to have three daughters and seven sons. ¹⁴ He named the daughters Jemimah, Keziah and Keren-happuch. ¹⁵ In all the land there were no women as esteemed as the daughters of Job. And Job gave his daughters and sons equal shares of his inheritance.

¹⁶ After this Job lived on to the age of 140 years -- long enough to see his great-grandchildren have children of their own. ¹⁷ And when Job died, he was old and full of days.

A former skinhead recounts her life in the racist underground

What drives a person to hate? How does hate transition from an emotion into an act of violence? What does it take to break free from hatred? What can be done to prevent hate and violence in our schools and the greater community?

Angela King grew up in South Florida, struggled with her identity, became disenfranchised, acted out through risky behaviors, and ultimately became a Skinhead. Skinheads became her "family." Crime became a way of life for her. In 1998, she was sentenced to six years in prison for her part in an armed robbery of a Jewish-owned video store in Hollywood, Florida. Today, Angela is a graduate student who speaks about her experiences with the hopes that she can prevent other soul searching students and young adults from finding solace and comfort in hate and bigotry.

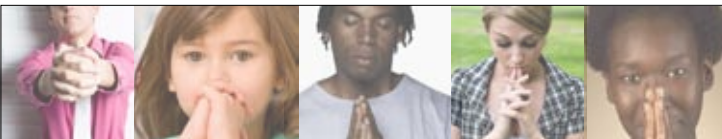

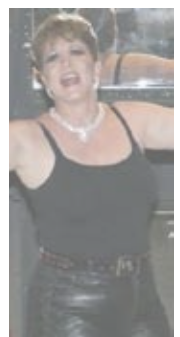

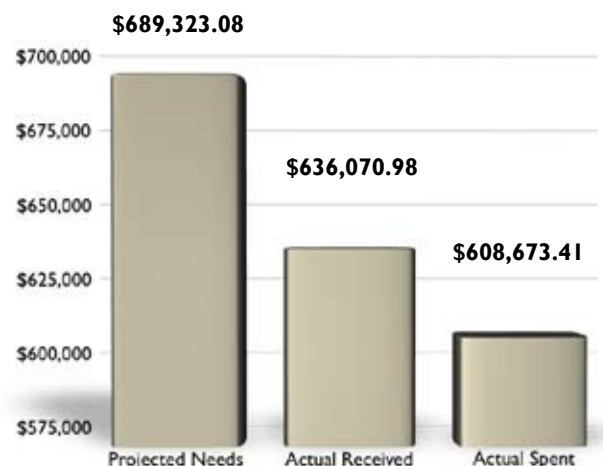
