We Listen

In Today's reading from Proverbs, Wisdom (or 'Woman Wisdom" as translated from her Hebrew name Hochma) can be found in public places – the city gates, the crossroads - telling everyone who is alive of her presence at creation, her delight in the human race, and God's delight in her. This image of wisdom in the Old Testament strongly resembles our understanding of the Holy Spirit in the New Testament. Many scholars have understood Hochma to be a female personification of God's creative and saving actions in the world.

Rev. Pat

Rev. Pat Farnan served in the United States Navy for 24 years. She earned a Bachelor of Technical Education and a Master of Science in **Educational Counseling** Degree from National University in San Diego, California and she received her Master of Divinity Degree from the Virginia Union University School of Theology in Richmond, Virginia in 2005. She was ordained by the Universal Fellowship of Metropolitan Community Churches, and came to Galveston as the planting pastor of Harbor MCC in October, 2005. Rev. Pat immediately began the process of preparing the congregation for public worship and becoming a fully affiliated church in the UFMCC. Harbor MCC was fully affiliated in July, 2006 and Rev. Pat was officially called to continue on as the Pastor of the newly affiliated church. The church was destroyed by Hurricane Ike and, with few members left to rebuild, Harbor MCC voted to disband in the spring of 2009. She is currently a member of Resurrection MCC and a facilitator for "Creating a Life That Matters".

Thank you for contributing to the Resurrection MCC 2010 Special Anniversary Offering Campaign: "We're 38 ... Help Keep Us Great!"

The seeds for Resurrection MCC were planted in the winter of 1971. These seeds took root in December of 1972, when meetings were started on a regular basis in a rented apartment in Preston Villa. Nearly 40 years later, we are a congregation of over 600 members holding two weekly Sunday services, and various midweek offerings, on a church campus that includes a 25,000 square foot church building and a 12,000 square foot activity center, situated on a 9-acre tract in the beautiful Heights area of Houston.

As you know, Resurrection MCC celebrated its 38th anniversary on April 25. On April 11, I announced the six-week 2010 Resurrection MCC Special Anniversary Offering Campaign entitled "We're 38 ... Help Keep Us Great!" The purpose of this campaign was to celebrate the 38th anniversary of the church, as well as to generate income for the general fund in order to reduce our budget variance.

In keeping with the "We're 38 ..." portion of the theme: The campaign goal was \$38,000. We asked that congregants prayerfully consider making an "over and above" offering in either denominations of \$38 (i.e., \$38, \$380 or \$3,800) or increments of \$38 (e.g., \$38, \$76, \$114, etc.) to commemorate the church's 38th anniversary. While we did not achieve 100% of the campaign goal, special anniversary offerings totaled nearly \$19,000 and our budget variance was reduced by \$2,173 during the six-week special anniversary offering campaign period. For those of you who made a special anniversary offering, thank you so much for your kindness, support and generosity!

Nearly 40 years ago, the first members of Resurrection MCC had the audacity to imagine that a church of Resurrection MCC's magnitude was possible from such humble beginnings. Through mature faith and commitment, the power of the Holy Spirit, and the grace of God, Resurrection MCC has experienced both numerical and spiritual growth over the last 38 years. Resurrection MCC remains committed to its long standing mission to demonstrate God's unconditional love to all people through Christian action, where inclusivity is a nonnegotiable value to be practiced daily. Together, we are doing what is necessary to help make our church home a facility that is reflective of the greatness of Jesus Christ!


