Community: A Way of Life

Inviting us to choose a "creative ordering of freedom," Larry Rasmussen (along with Jesus) challenges us to refuse selfcentered practices of acquisition in favor of that which strengthens and uplifts the community as a whole; in favor of a shared Way of Life.

Silent Reflection

Quaker silent worship is an attenuated openness to the inspiration of God or the Spirit. If considered a form of meditation, it differs historically from other meditative forms in lacking a mantra as in Orthodox Christian or Hindu meditation, or a focal image as in Tibetan Buddhism. A Reading from "Shaping Communities"

by Larry Rasmussen, in Practicing Our Faith: A Way of Life for a Searching People; edited by Dorothy C. Bass

Rather than shaping his followers into the usual hierarchy of power, Jesus constituted his community around power turned upside down. The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke tell us of a time very near the end of Jesus' life when the disciples are arguing. "Which of us will be the greatest?" they ask, jockeying for position. Jesus tells them that the shape of authority in his community is different from what they assume. His radical pattern for shaping communities could be usefully described by a phrase from current leadership studies: "creative deviance on the front line." It is deviance because it does not accept standard forms of ordering life as normative, even when they are dominant. It is creative because it seeks a positive alternative form. It is on the front line because it lives in the tension between our own time - what the apostle Paul called "this present age" - and another yet to come. The last are first. Leaders are community servants, like Jesus himself. (selected and abridged from the section "The Community of Jesus")


