Opening Essay

It's Time: To Weave Together in Love

As I prayed Psalm 139 a metaphor surfaced: God as Weaver. In verse 13 the Psalmist says, "you knit me together in my mother's womb." A few verses later the Psalmist describes being "intricately woven in the depths of the earth (v15)."

God the Weaver has woven our lives from a deep and passionate place. We are formed with the very "stuff" of God.

Such weaving leads to deep connection. Indeed, we are inseparable. We are woven into the fabric of God and each other.

It's time for us to recognize this deep connection and respond by treating ourselves and each other with a renewed sense of Holy Awe.

This week's scriptures, readings and applications are inspired by the call of Psalm 139. This call is echoed in Christ's sharing of his own body at the table and Paul's reminder that we are all a part of the Body of Christ. The scriptures for Friday and Saturday will prepare you for worship on September 16 for the message, "It's Time: To Search Until We Find."

Scripture can guide us, if we bring our questions to it. So, also, can those in our own generation who give words to the questions we need to ask and direction to the work of reformation and restoration--earth scientists, committed politicians, farmers, teachers, contemplatives, poets. If we listen, we can hear the conversation all about us from which a way of repentance and renewal is emerging. The Spirit breathes with the body, and moves among us in surprising ways."

Spiritual Maturity & Application

Rosa Parks became a courageous leader for civil rights because she came to understand that she was "fearfully and wonderfully made" (Psalm 139: 14) by God and was worthy of the same rights and privileges as others. Like Queen Esther in the Hebrew Scriptures (see Monday's reading) Rosa Parks drew on her inner resources to become a catalyst for change. How is God calling you to become a "weaver of justice" in the world? What demands are you currently facing at "such a time as this" calling on you to draw from inner resources. *Pray or journal these questions.*

In addition to her thoughts in the above Sacred Reading, Marilyn Chandler McEntyre writes, "If we are 'members of one another'...what damages you cannot be good for me." With a group of spiritual companions, discuss what this may mean in caring for your own body, for each other in your group, for others in the wider world, and for the natural world itself.

Pray Psalm 139. Are you aware of God's design for you life? Ask God to help you write a life mission statement. What did God have in mind for you when your body was still being formed? How is God forming you spiritually now? Who does God want you to become? What are your dreams, your goals, your special abilities, your spiritual gifts? How does God want to use them? Dare to pray boldly. Dare to dream boldly.

Emerging Church



Emerging Church Worship is actually a considerably new concept. Many of us at Resurrection grew up in what is known as the Modern world. Starting in the 1950's, the United States entered a modern era. Computers were a completely new element. Some of the machines of that day actually took up entire buildings! An interesting fact to think about is that the computer you have in your office or your home

has more computing power than the computer used to send the first spacecraft to the Moon. We have come a long way.


