

The Pharisees and legal experts, positioned here as Jesus' antagonists, present the challenge that will occupy Jesus throughout this chapter. Jesus' response takes the form of two brief. interrelated parables and a lengthy story. All are focused on the recovery of what was lost, followed by celebration at the finding. In effect, Jesus' table fellowship mirrors the joy and festivity characteristic of God over us all, not just the religious people.

**Opening Essay** 

#### It's Time: To Search Until We Find

As I write this my heart is drawn back to six years ago today. It is a day we describe with three unforgettable numbers: 9-11. On September 11, 2001, so much was lost: husbands, grandmothers, lovers, mothers, friends, fathers, sons, partners, daughters...innocence, peace, security--and for some, hope.

Some might say: "That was six years ago. I'm tired of hearing about 9-11. I don't want to be reminded of that awful day. When are we going to move on? It's time for closure."

When it comes to loss, closure is the wrong word. One "closes" on buying a house, not on loss. Grief cannot be measured by predictable stages. Grief cannot be checked off a "to do" list. Many of those most deeply touched by 9-11 are on a search for renewed wholeness. They have good days and bad days. For some this search will take a lifetime.

In Luke 15, Jesus tells three stories that deal with loss. One involves a lost sheep, another a lost coin, and the final a lost son. In all three stories, the search for what was lost requires persistence, understanding, faith, compassion...and time.

These are great stories of hope. On one hand they admit that the search is never easy. On the other hand they reveal that as long as one continues to search one continues to hope.

As a church, we are called to be a place where people find strength for their search. Together, we remind each other that we are not alone in our search. We restore each other to hope. As we mature, we live more and more from a deep place of joy. We dance together and join hands in celebration. And we also join hearts in our grief.

As part of your prayers and reflections this week, I invite you to pray with me daily for those dealing with grief, be it from 9-11 or from other losses.

#### Sacred Reading

What are you looking for today and where will your search be successful? The quest for God is always successful when carried out where God is to be found. Where shall we begin the search? The deep inner rooms of our own soul, sacred scriptures, the book of history, current events, the lives of the saints, the poor and oppressed seeking our compassion, and the creation itself offer places where God has been most readily found in the past. Today, pay attention to what has your undivided attention and follow the clues to a closer walk with God.

#### Spiritual Maturity & Application

Tuesday's reading is Luke 15: 11-32, one of the great "search and find" stories in the Bible. Read this passage silently and create an "inner DVD" of it. Picture the scenes and characters evoked by this scripture. Converse with each character: the younger prodigal son; the angry, perfectionist older son; the heartbroken father; and the unseen mother.

With whom do you identify most? Why? Return to the older sibling, identifying with times you may have been self-righteous, judgmental, or unmindful of the bigger picture. Now, consider the father. How are you called to grow in maturity to become more like the father in your life. How may Resurrection MCC grow in maturity to become more like the father in ministering to our community?

Joe Cristina, founder of the Children Affected by AIDS Foundation, writes, "Worldwide, nearly 40 million people are living with HIV and AIDS. Over 13 million children have been orphaned due to AIDS. Six hundred thousand children are infected with HIV each year. And 25 years into the AIDS pandemic, no vaccine or cure is in sight. The numbers speak for themselves. What are you doing to help?"

Journal or discuss with spiritual companions how you have been impacted by AIDS. Pray for those who are searching for a vaccine or cure. Pray for those who live each day with HIV or AIDS.

### Storm Recovery Update

We had another close call this week with Hurricane Humberto. Many of you came by to see if you could help secure the property as a precaution to the projected rainfall. I stand in awe that over the years weather has challenged our brick and mortar, but never our church. Resurrection members and friends always pull together and find a way to worship.

That is what happened back in June when our roof gave way to heavy wind and rain. Water was pouring into our music room and offices and was threatening our sanctuary. But within a few hours, Resurrection family moved all the furniture out of harm's way and a restoration crew arrived to remove the excess water and install a temporary patch on the roof.

Since that day, we have been seeking approval from our insurance to begin reconstruction of the roof, walls, and ceiling that were damaged. Unfortunately, our insurance company denied the claim and on Monday, September 10, our public adjuster informed me that he sees no way to argue their denial. The Board of Directors is currently in dialogue with our banks to secure the financing to move forward with the repairs and I have been gathering estimates.

I'll keep you posted as we continue the recovery efforts. Your continued prayers and support are greatly appreciated.




