



In this season of Pentecost, we gather to await the presence of the Holy Spirit into our midst, as we invoke her presence with our singing and our worship.

We Worship

This Hymn was written by Joachim Neander, born in 1650, whose father, grandfather, great-grandfather, and great-great-grandfather were all preachers. Joachim often took long walks near his home in Hochdal, Germany. They were worship walks, and he frequently composed hymns as he strolled, singing them to God. He was the first hymn writer from the Calvinist branch of Protestantism. He wrote this hymn when he was 30, just before he died of tuberculosis. Neander wrote fifty-six hymn texts that were all published in 1680, the year of his death.

We Hear the Word

This is a psalm of trust and confidence in God, influenced by the wisdom tradition. The psalm offers unqualified divine protection and guidance for the righteous, which explains the popularity of the psalm for those engaged in perilous undertakings.

In today's anthem, Psalm 8 is invoked at the beginning of the piece. This psalm is a glorious song of praise, addressed solely to God. It celebrates the majestic nature of God's name in all the earth and the dignity and distinctive role of human beings. Tom Fettke goes further by adding a chorus of alleluias that builds and builds in intensity to bask in the glory and majesty of God.

He said to him, "if they do not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."

The psychologist Samuel Southard prayed this prayer with the chief administrator at Church of the Savior, in West Hollywood, who was dying of AIDS. He calls it *One Pebble's Prayer*:

Dear Jesus:

I feel like a pebble on the beach, washed in and out by waves of pain and relief, fatigue and rest, fitful sleep and alertness. What am I supposed to do about this? I want to maintain some control of my life. I need some anchor, some mooring. So much is breaking loose!

Let's plan together. I'll live with this sloshing back and forth if you'll keep some deep ballast in me so I don't tip over. You be the anchor within that holds me fast to you. Then I'll be upright even when I must flow in and out of consciousness, rock to-and-fro with pain. You're the solid foundation that keeps me from panic when I lose a grip on myself.

So this is where I am right now. My outer security is washing away, but my eternal security is more reliable as I fix my heart and mind upon you. Amen.

Spiritual Maturity & Application

Psalms 8 is an invitation to receive God's trust. It is also an invitation to live in trustworthy mutuality with those around us.

Elizabeth Hinson-Hasty writes, "What would our world, our attitudes, our practices, and even our political policies look like if we began to see and value God, the environment, all creatures, and human beings in mutually beneficial and covenantal relationship?" Reflect on Hinson-Hasty's question in light of Psalm 8.

Read Psalm 23 and write a list of all the verbs you find. How do these verbs give you insight into God's active care for you? How do these verbs draw you into a greater trust in God? Reflect in your journal or discuss with friends.

Pray the following affirmation three different ways. First, insert your own name into the blanks. Then insert the name of someone for whom you are praying. Finally, insert "Resurrection MCC" into the openings:

"Rejoice indeed that you see God's hand in all the happenings and the keepings of the day. Protected, the Israelites crossed the Red Sea; so _____ are you protected in all things. _____, rely on this and go forward. You have now entered upon the stage of success. You must not doubt this, _____. You must see this. Beyond all doubt you must know it. It is true. It is sure. _____, go forward now and conquer. _____, go forward unafraid."

We believe in God's unconditional love for everyone.


We believe in the saving grace of Jesus Christ and the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit.



Did we buy a new organ?


The answer is: NO! Many of you will notice that we have a new organ console sitting on the chancel. That organ is a Wicks Royal Classic Organ. It is a new design from the Wicks Pipe Organ Co. of Highland, IL. Because of a long-standing relationship between me and that family-owned business, they have agreed to place this brand new digitally sampled organ in

our sanctuary as a demonstration instrument to people in the South Texas Region who might be interested in purchasing one. The Wicks Organ Co. will be sending people to our worship space to hear the organ and have me or Joel demonstrate its capabilities to them. In return, we get to use the instrument free of charge. If the organ should be sold, they will bring us another instrument of equal or greater capacity!

This particular organ has a larger console and more speakers and amplifiers, but does have a few less stops than our other instrument. However, this instrument is digitally sampled note by note and stop by stop from the vintage organ at the Basilica in St. Louis, Mo. You will notice a fuller sound coming from this instrument and the different colors of the organ will amaze all listeners. Feel free to come by and take a look at the beautiful console as well.




