As the prelude begins, the congregation is invited to be in an attitude of preparation for the worship of God.

We Worship

This hymn came from Anthony Showalter, principal of the southern Normal Musical Institute in Dalton, GA. Showalter published over 130 music books with combined sales of two million copies. He became known through the South for his singing schools in local churches. In 1887 he received two letters from former pupils, each being heartbroken over the loss of a spouse. Showalter went to the Bible looking for verses to comfort them. He selected Deuteronomy 33:27 - "The eternal God is your refuge, and underneath are everlasting arms..." From that he wrote the chorus and sent a letter to his friend hymnist Elisha Hoffman asking her to come up with verses. She wrote three stanzas and sent them back. He set it to music, and these words have cheered us in adversity.

We Hear the Word

The drama presentation is taken directly from the story of Jonah and the Whale. Yet in this case we look particularly at the witness of the worm.

The miracle of the feeding of the five thousand is the only miracle of Jesus found in all four of the Gospels. The disciples respond to Jesus' question with rational excuses about lack of money and lack of food, not recognizing that Jesus himself will meet the crowd's needs. Jesus becomes the host who welcomes and invites the community to share in God's hospitality. And the abundance of the miracle is highly stressed in all four Gospel accounts. There is food left over!

The people realized that God was at work among them in what Jesus had just done. They said, "This is the Prophet for sure, God's Prophet right here in Galilee!" Jesus saw that in their enthusiasm, they were about to grab him and make him a king, so he slipped off and went back up the mountain to be by himself.

Spiritual Maturity & Application



The chart below reveals the "key results" from our "gift" component of the commitment cards. The Board






