## We Worship

This hymn first appeared in a book of hymns edited by Rev. John Rippon of Carter's Lane Baptist Church in London, where he pastored for 63 years. The author of the hymn simply bore the letter "K".

Many scholars attribute the composition to Robert Keene, the minister of music under Rev. Rippon. The unique power of this hymn is due to the fact that each of the seven original stanzas were based on various biblical promises. The first verse established the theme - God's Word is sufficient foundation for our faith. Then the author selected precious promises; Isaiah 41:10, Isaiah 32:2, II Corinthians 12:9 and Hebrews 13:5.

This hymn was first published under the title *Exceedingly Great and Precious Promises*.

# We Hear the Word

This Hebrew text is part of a pivotal narrative. It sets the stage for the overall movement of the book of Numbers from the death of the old wilderness generation to the birth of a new generation of hope on the edge of the promised land.

This gospel reading is sometimes called the *Great Commission*. Disciples do not live for themselves. Jesus commissions this group of disciples to form a worldwide mission community of Jewish and Gentile disciples that live out Jesus' teaching. To do so is to be an alternative or *queer* community with commitments and practices that are antithetical to Rome's values and practices.

Instead of military power, it employs compassionate power, healing, mercy, an inclusive community, and life-giving words to proclaim and enact God's empire. The community of disciples carries out this task in a world marked by imperial lies and hostility. But

Jesus' presence strengthens and guides, "to the end of the age."

**Numbers 13:17-20, 25-28, 30-32, 14:1-2**

When Moses sent them off to scout out Canaan, he said, "Go up through the Nebev and then into the hill country. Look the land over, see what it is like. Assess the people: are they strong or weak? Are there few or many? Observe the land: Is it pleasant or harsh? Describe the towns where they live: Are they open camps or fortified with walls? And the soil: Is it fertile or barren? Are there forests? And try to bring back a sample of the produce that grows there - this is the season for the first ripe grapes." After forty days of scouting out the land, they returned home.

They presented themselves before Moses and Aaron and the whole congregation of People of Israel in the Wilderness of Paran at Kadesh. They reported to the whole congregation and showed them the fruit of the land. Then they told the story of their trip:

"We went to the land to which you sent us and, oh! It *does* flow with milk and honey! Just look at this fruit! The only thing is that the people who live there are fierce, their cities are huge and well fortified. Worse yet, we saw descendants of the giant Anak.

Caleb interrupted, called for silence before Moses, and said, "Let's go up and take the land - now. We can do it."

The whole community was in an uproar, wailing all night long. All the People of Israel grumbled against Moses and Aaron. The entire community was in on it: "Why didn't we die in Egypt? Or in this wilderness? Why has God brought us to this country to kill us? Our wives and children are about to become plunder. Why don't we just head back to Egypt? And right now!"

# Grow Up

### Opening Essay

## *Listening for Change*

The story of Jesus calling fishers to follow him is one of the greatest change stories in scripture. Mark 1:16-20 begins with Jesus taking a nice seaside stroll. Things get wild fast when Jesus sees Simon and Andrew casting their net into the sea and then says something crazy to them: "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." Their nice little fishing excursion becomes an entry point for radical change.

They put down their fishing nets and they follow Jesus. Their lives change forever. They break with family. They break with their careers. They break with tradition.

Why would they do something so truly disruptive and apparently crazy? Maybe they were really listening. Perhaps they were looking deep inside themselves, tapping into a deep craving for new meaning, direction, and purpose in their lives.

The scriptures and readings this week invite us to consider the call of change in our lives. The call to change may be as radical as a change in a relationship or career. Or perhaps the call to change may involve a renewed self-discipline.

It is in the nature of God to use change to draw us beyond ourselves, to teach us new ways of thinking, to challenge us to new ways of being. This can be scary. Yet Jesus and the disciples moved past their fears to embrace change. Maybe they did so by recalling the inspiration from Joshua 1:9 where God says to Joshua, "Be strong and courageous: do not be frightened or dismayed, for God is with you wherever you go." With such a promise, we can take the risk of change.

## *Spiritual Maturity & Application*




