Dating from the eighth century or earlier, this Irish hymn was translated into prose by Mary Byrne. It was then versified by Eleanor Hull, author of several books on Irish literature and history. David Evans arranged the Irish melody for this text in 1927.

We Hear the Word

This psalm is a meditative individual hymn of praise to God, lifting up and singling out the character and deeds of God that call for such praise. The psalm is the last of the eight alphabetical acrostic poems, with each line beginning with a different letter of Hebrew alphabet.

The election and call of the Thessalonians provides motivation for another expression of thanksgiving. This obligatory thanksgiving leads to an exhortation that the Thessalonians maintain the authentic traditions received from Paul.

We Respond

This hymn was written by Katherine Hankey in 1866. Born in Clapham, England, Katherine Hankey belonged to the Clapham Sect of Evangelicals and established a Bible class for girls in London's West End. This hymn is drawn from her extended poem on the life of Jesus, which also contains *Tell Me the Old, Old Story*.

Opening Essay

Live with Strong Purpose

Looking at where your life is today, is there anything you would do differently? When is the last time you've thought about the roads you didn't take?

In the book *Ears to Hear, Eyes to See*, Don Bouldin writes about how a group of people aged 95 and over were asked what they would do differently. Several themes emerged.

Most said they would live with more intention around their life purpose. Their advice: spend more time considering who you are, what you are here for, and who God is calling you to become. Ask yourself, "What makes life worth living and fulfilling?" They also advised focusing on friends, family and faith--with the understanding that this focus would demand daily forgiveness.

The second theme was risk taking. The seniors advised taking more risks to accomplish more. The challenge: Don't be afraid of failure or mistakes. Climb out on the limbs to go for the greater fruit.

The third theme was to focus on things of eternal value. Invest in eternity. Make this world a better place because you were here. Work to bring heaven on earth.

In a similar vein, Billy Graham was asked if he could go back and re-preach his sermons was there anything he would change. Billy Graham said he would preach less about sin and judgment and more about love and grace.

My prayer for you is that the scriptures, readings, and applications for this week will guide you to make choices today that will impact how you feel about your life for years to come.

Imagine a life with fewer regrets and greater purpose!

Sacred Reading

Spiritual Maturity & Application

COMMIT...It Does a Body Good.

The stewardship team got together this week to review the results of the "my key to our abundance" stewardship drive. The goal of the stewardship team is to educate the congregation to be "good stewards" of the resources we have as a body of Christ. We are a team of individuals who firmly believe that giving

our lives and resources is not a legal requirement but an opportunity for spiritual growth.

So we had to ask ourselves, why did only 1/3 of our congregation complete a commitment card? The cards that came in were a true blessing in that 170 people committed in various ways to be present, to pray, to serve and to give their lives as a resource to the body of Christ. Knowing that 170 people are committed to the work of God is a powerful result. We also noticed that this 1/3 is pledging to meet 1/2 of our weekly financial need. Clearly, they are a group that is stretching themselves to grow.

So what about the other 2/3 of the congregation? Why was the 4-part sermon series, individual testimonies, bulletin articles, drama skit, and inspirational music and worship throughout the month of October not enough to inspire everyone to participate in this spiritual growth opportunity. We decided we must not have fully educated the congregation or properly communicated the importance of the commitment. Below is a question and answer series that we hope will help you become "the key to our abundance."

Why is it important to complete the commitment card?

Formalizing your commitment to be present, pray, serve, and give is a statement of faith and an act of accountability. When you put your commitment to God in writing, you are allowing yourself to be vulnerable and accountable to the Body of Christ. This is a real growth opportunity. Once you set a goal in life, it becomes more real when you share it with your friends and family. Keeping your giftedness secret is a safety net. As long as we convince ourselves that "it's between God and I" we will never fully open ourselves to the community God gives us to serve. This is the "release" and "surrender" part of our faith. Also, we can work together more effectively and efficiently when we come together and openly share our resources.

What does the church do with these commitments?

The stewardship team will send you a letter thanking you for your participation and itemizing your areas of commitment so you can have a record of your faithfulness. Your financial commitment is entered into the system to provide the Board of Directors an estimate of our tithes and offering. When you formalize your financial commitment it is not a legal agreement and you will not receive an invoice or request for payment. Communicating your financial commitment has a two-fold purpose: to help you be accountable for your commitment and to help the financial leaders of the church be accountable for when and how it is spent. Your financial pledge helps the

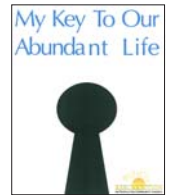
financial leaders of Resurrection make quality and informed decisions based on accurate estimates. You are assisting us in being good stewards by allowing us to plan the spending needs to operate the church. To help you in your accountability, we will list your pledge on your annual itemized statement of contributions. We realize that life circumstances can alter your ability to give the amount pledged and you can adjust your pledge at any time. Again, you will not be billed or invoiced or harassed in any way.

I am already actively participating and giving to the ministries. Why do you need me to complete the card?

Our spiritual gifts are an evolving and moving aspect of our spirituality. You should make it a practice to complete a spiritual gifts inventory every year or so to see how God is shaping you (you can download this tool on our Web site). Renewing your commitment gives you an opportunity to hear a fresh word from God about your calling. You may be asked to give less in certain areas, so God can stretch you to give more in other ways. Or you may need a Sabbath (a period of rest) to revitalize your ministry. Financial gifts will also evolve and move in much the same way. Take the commitment card and sit and listen to what God holds for you. Completing your commitment card then becomes a valuable spiritual practice.

When does the commitment begin?

The commitment begins when you turn in the card and will last until you complete a new card. The stewardship team conducts this commitment drive annually and typically in the fall. Therefore today's commitment will last until the fall of 2008. All we ask is that you put in writing what you are able to commit right now in terms of time, talent, and resources. You can update your commitment at any time.

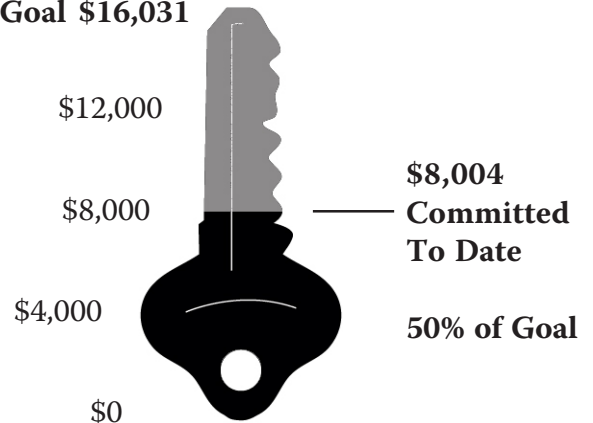

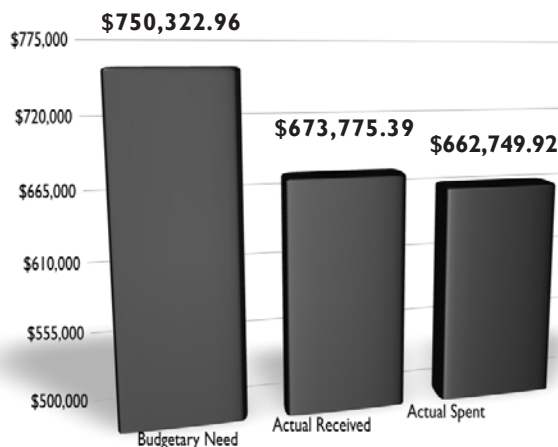
