This hymn represents the joining of two Thanksgiving hymns by nineteenth-century poet, Henry Alford, and eighteenth-century poet, Anna Laetitia Aiken Barbauld. The creator of this combined form, which appeared early in the twentieth century, is not known.

We Hear the Word

In both Jewish and Christian Bibles, the book of Malachi concludes the Prophets. In the three-part organization of the Jewish Bible, it is followed by the Writings, while in Christian canonical order (where the Prophets appear at the end of the Old Testament in order to emphasize their foreshadowing of Jesus), Malachi is followed by the Gospel of Matthew. The book gives no information about its author. Even the name Malachi, which means 'my messenger,' may have been taken from the figure described in the third chapter.

2 Thessalonians was originally believed to be Paul's second letter to the Thessalonian people. However, in more recent years scholars have given evidence that this letter was probably written and attributed to Paul to honor him, even though he most likely did not write it. This passage contains three exhortations: Avoid those who do not follow the Pauline tradition, avoid unruliness and avoid those who will not obey the letter.

This spiritual references the parable of the ten virgins in Matthew 25. It reminds us to keep alert until our work is done!

COMMIT...It Does a Body Good.

The stewardship team gathered together to review the results of the "My Key to Our Abundance" stewardship drive. The goal of the stewardship team is to educate the congregation to be "good stewards" of the resources we have as a body of Christ. We are a team of individuals who firmly believe that giving our lives and resources is not a requirement but an opportunity for spiritual growth.

So we had to ask ourselves, why did only 1/3 of our congregation complete a commitment card? The cards that came in were a true blessing in that 172 people committed in various ways to be present, to pray, to serve and to give their lives as a resource to the body of Christ. Knowing that 172 people are committed to the work of God is a powerful result. We also noticed that this 1/3 is pledging to meet 1/2 of our weekly financial need. Clearly, they are a group that is stretching themselves to grow.

So what about the other 2/3 of the congregation? Why was the 4-part sermon series, individual testimonies, bulletin articles, drama skit, and inspirational music and worship throughout the month of October not enough to inspire everyone to participate in this spiritual growth opportunity. We decided we must not have fully educated the congregation or properly communicated the importance of the commitment. Below is a question and answer series that we hope will help you become "the key to our abundance."

Why is it important to complete the commitment card?

Formalizing your commitment to be present, pray, serve, and give is a statement of faith and an act of accountability. When you put your commitment to God in writing, you are allowing yourself to be vulnerable and accountable to the Body of Christ. This is a real growth opportunity. Once you set a goal in life, it becomes more real when you share it with your friends and family. Keeping your giftedness secret is a safety net. As long as we convince ourselves that "it's between God and I" we will never fully open ourselves to the community God gives us to serve. This is the "release" and "surrender" part of our faith. Also, we can work together more effectively and efficiently when we come together and openly share our resources.

What does the church do with these commitments?

The stewardship team will send you a letter itemizing your areas of commitment so you can have a record of your faithfulness. Your financial commitment is noted to help the leaders of Resurrection make high quality and informed decisions based on accurate estimates. When you formalize your financial commitment it is not a legal agreement and you will not receive an invoice or request for payment. We realize that life circumstances can alter your ability to give the amount pledged and you can adjust your pledge at any


time. Again, you will not be billed or invoiced or harassed in any way.

I am already actively participating and giving to the ministries. Why do you need me to complete the card?

Our spiritual gifts are an evolving and moving aspect of our spirituality. You should make it a practice to complete a spiritual gifts inventory every year or so to see how God is shaping you (you can download this tool on our Web site). Renewing your commitment gives you an opportunity to hear a fresh word from God about your calling. You may be asked to give less in certain areas, so God can stretch you to give more in other ways. Or you may need a Sabbath (a period of rest) to revitalize your ministry. Financial gifts will also evolve and move in much the same way. Take the commitment card and sit and listen to what God holds for you. Completing your commitment card then becomes a valuable spiritual practice.

When does the commitment begin?


The commitment begins when you turn in the card (please mail or bring to church) and will last until you complete a new card. The stewardship team conducts this commitment drive annually, typically in the fall. Therefore today's commitment will last until the fall of 2008. All we ask is that you put in writing what you are able to commit right now in terms of time, talent, and resources. You can update your commitment at any time.


