

We Prepare

As the prelude begins, the congregation is invited to be in an attitude of expectation for the worship of God.

We Worship

The angelic hosts proclaim to the shepherds God's gift of life and hope over the plains and mountains. It is a great message of music, for the ancient carol has the shepherds responding to the glorious message of heaven by moving forward in faith to see the Christ of lowly birth. The refrain reflects moving parts in each voice to proclaim that God's glory is being sent to earth in the Christ. There have been many versions of this hymn, which was first published in 1855, but all stem from the same source, *Holy Family Hymnal* (1860). It came to have prominence in hymnals during this century by way of an anonymous version from a mystery play entitled "The Nativity" in 1922. Several minor adjustments to the hymn make it more useful in today's congregations.

We Hear the Word

This is a communal lament, a genre well known from the book of Psalms. Such laments typically contain, as does this poem, a description of the community's beleaguered state and an appeal to God for redemption. Often there is also assurance from God that the petitioners' requests will be granted, but that is not present here.

It was fitting, that it accomplished God's plan. Many children The redeemed. Glory Their salvation and ultimate eschatological inheritance. The one who makes holy is Christ. The words Brothers and sisters are from quotations in v. 12. The early church readily applied the whole of Psalm 22 to Jesus. In the early church's interpretation of Psalm 22:22, Jesus stands with the people, proclaiming and praising God's name. He is thus fully identified with the people. The author understands Jesus as the speaker in the next two quotations from Isaiah 8:17-18.

During a year's sabbatical from his ministry at Holy Trinity Church in Philadelphia, author Phillips Brooks (1835-1893) rode to Bethlehem on horseback for Christmas Eve 1865. As a year that had seen the end of the American Civil War and the assassination of an American President drew to a close, Brooks' longing for peace found expression as he pondered the "everlasting light" that had shone in Bethlehem's "dark streets."

Once believed to have been composed by Martin Luther, its origin, text and tune have been traced by modern research to the United States of the nineteenth century. Although the text is of unknown origin, the tune AWAY IN A MANGER was composed by James R. Murray (1842-1905). At one time he taught music in the public schools of Andover, Massachusetts. He later served as an editor for a publisher of sacred music.

When Kenneth Cummings Jr. was murdered last June, his murderer exclaimed that he was Elijah, called by God to carry out a code of retribution by killing a gay man.

And there was silence. Not a single clergy person spoke out in protest.

On January 6, 2008, they will speak out. At *A Raising of Voices*, members of the clergy, the gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender community, and friends of human rights will speak out at a vigil of resolve. At *A Raising of Voices*, we will lament that earlier silence with music and stories and proclaim that the common thread of all religions is love, not hate. We will resolve to work for a more just society for all.

Rev. Dwayne is one of several clergy participating, and everyone is invited to join in *A Raising of Voices*, as we remember Kenneth Cummings Jr. and commit ourselves to speak out in compassion for all people.


