We Worship

This hymn is known as the African American National Anthem. It places emphasis on the history of people of African descent, inclusive of their many triumphs and struggles. This great song is known across the world, but the history behind the song's creation and first performance is often unknown.

Publicly performed first as a poem as part of a celebration of Lincoln's Birthday on February 12, 1900 by 500 schoolchildren at the segregated Stanton School in Jacksonville, Florida. Principal James Weldon Johnson wrote the words to introduce its honored guest, Booker T. Washington. The poem was later set to music by Mr. Johnson's brother, John, in 1905. Singing this song quickly became a way for African Americans to demonstrate their patriotism and hope for the future.

We Hear the Word

2 Kings 5:1-7

Now Naaman was commander of the Syrian army. He was a great officer and highly esteemed. It was at Naaman's hand that God gave a victory to Syria. He was a mighty warrior. And he had leprosy.

On one of their raids the Syrians captured a young woman who was an Israelite. She became a servant to Naaman's wife. One day she said to Naaman's wife, "If only Naaman would go to the prophet who is in Samaria! He would cure Naaman's leprosy."

Naaman went to the ruler and told him what the Israelite woman said. "By all means go," the ruler replied. "I will send a letter to the ruler of Israel." So Naaman left, taking ten talents of silver, six thousand shekels of gold and ten sets of clothing. The letter that he took to the ruler of Israel read, "With this letter I am sending my attendant Naaman to you so that you may cure him of leprosy."

As soon as the ruler of Israel read the letter, he tore his clothes in fear, and shouted, "Am I God? Do I have power over death and life? Why does this Syrian ruler send one to me to be cured of leprosy? See how he is trying to pick a fight with me!"

2 Kings 5:8-14

When Elisha the prophet of God learned that the ruler of Israel tore his robes in fear, he sent a message to the ruler, "Why did you tear your robes? Have Naaman come to me and he will learn that there is a prophet in Israel." So Naaman went with his horses and chariots and stopped at the door of Elisha's house. Elisha sent a messenger outside to say to Naaman, "Go, wash yourself seven times in the Jordan, and your flesh will be restored and you will be cured."

Yet Naaman went away angry, and said, "I thought that he would surely come out to me and stand there before me, calling on the name of God, and wave his hand over my skin and cure me of my leprosy. Are not Abana and Pharpar, the rivers of Damascus, better than any of the waters of Israel? Couldn't I wash in them and be cured?" So he turned away and went away in a rage.

Naaman's attendants went to him saying, "If the prophet had told you to do some difficult thing, would you have not done it? How much more, then, when all he said to you was, 'Wash and be cured?'"

So Naaman went down and immersed himself in the Jordan seven times, as the prophet of God told him, and his flesh was restored and became unblemished like that of a youth.

We believe in God's unconditional love for everyone.


We believe in the saving grace of Jesus Christ and the empowering presence of the Holy Spirit.





Spiritual Deepening Practice: Reflecting on Sacred Stories

Then those who revered God talked with each other, telling stories of their spiritual journeys and God listened and heard. A scroll of remembrance was written in God's presence concerning these who spoke of their walk with God and how they honor God's life with their own. "They will be mine," says the Holy One, "in the day when I make up my treasured possession. I will uplift them, just as in compassion a parent holds fast to beloved children. And you will again see the distinction between the lives of those who turn to God and the lives of those who turn away, between those who serve God and those who do not.

-- Malachi 3:16-18, adapted

Reflecting upon the witness of Malachi in the Hebrew Scriptures, devout practitioners of the Jewish faith say that when pious people sit and tell holy stories, God comes and listens. Generations of people of African descent have marked the "way out of no way," from despair into faith and from bondage into freedom, with words lifted in song and story. LGBTQIA peoples have for years braved violences of all kinds to bring story from silence, to speak our truth into life. Faith ... freedom ... life ... God-with-us is proclaimed in the Sacred Stories we share and in the death-defying, life-affirming, community/ies we form, rooted in stories of faith. Bill Moyers writes: "Once in East Africa, on the shores of an ancient lake, I sat alone and suddenly it struck me what community is. It is gathering around a fire and listening to someone tell us a story." The meditative practice of Sacred Storytelling involves receiving a faith-story in such a way that when listening, even if others are present, a person should assume that on a spiritual level the story is being told "just for me," and should ask, "Why would God intend for me to hear this particular story at this particular time?" Listen - what is God intending for you to hear through it's telling at this time? Read the story aloud. Listen to the words.

During the season of journeying, following the wintering sun, a tired bird came to rest on a branch. The clouds danced above him as the grasses in the field below made music with the breeze. In the distance an old barn gently shadowed the earth; a gray cat padded gracefully in its shade, a shadow within a shadow. The bird relaxed. He enjoyed the view from the branch and the safety it offered him from dangerous animals. "Life is good," he thought contentedly, "life is good!" Just then a strong wind pressed its way over the field; the young tree the bird was resting in started swaying back and forth. The bird held tight to the branch as the gusts began to come with such great intensity that it seemed that the bough would break. Watching the wild leaves as they whirled all around him, the bird thought contentedly, "Life is good, life is good!" For he knew two important truths: One, he was a bird, made by God with wings to fly, and fly he could, anytime he needed to - this he could rely on; and Two, God made more trees than he would ever see in his lifetime, with branches upon which he could rest, anytime he needed to - on this he could rely. He spread his wings then, and flew refreshed into the storm.

Relax. Listen inside yourself for God's word within you. After 3-5 minutes of spiritually receptive listening note anything you may have received for your journey ...


