Juneteenth

Juneteenth, also known as Freedom Day or Emancipation Day, is a holiday in the United States honoring African American heritage by commemorating the announcement of the abolition of slavery in the U.S. State of Texas in 1865. On June 19, 1865, legend has it while standing on the balcony of Galveston's Ashton Villa, General Granger read the contents of General Order No. 3: "The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free ..." Former slaves in Galveston rejoiced in the streets with jubilant celebrations. Celebrated on June 19, the state of Texas is widely considered the first U.S. state to begin Juneteenth celebrations, with informal observances taking place for over a century.

CRUISING THE BIBLE:

A QUEER JOURNEY THROUGH SCRIPTURE

MONDAYS JUNE 6 - JUNE 27 ACTIVITIES BLDG. 7 PM

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE TO ATTEND

Too often, we focus on the six "clobber" passages in the Bible when talking about our sexuality and spirituality. Are there other "queer" passages or even gay figures in the bible? Is it possible that Jesus was gay? What about sexuality in general in the Bible (homo and hetero)? For years, many folks have been asking, "What does the Bible say about homosexuality?" but for June (Pride Month), we will instead be asking, "What do queer folk have to say about the Bible?"

Join us on Monday nights in June for a 4-week small group study on what it means to read the Bible from a gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender perspective. Using our personal stories, video clips and music from pop culture, and RARELY discussed scripture passages, we will open our eyes to read the Bible like it has never been read before!

Due to the graphic content of some scripture passages, you must be 18 years of age or older to participate.

FRIENDSHIP AT THE MARGINS

WEDNESDAYS JUNE 1 - JUNE 29 ACTIVITIES BLDG. 7 PM

Is friendship a religious vocation? What do our friendships with people say about our friendship with God? What does it mean to treat marginalized people with friendship instead of viewing them as potential converts? In our anonymous and dehumanized world, the simple practice of friendship is radically countercultural. Join us on Wednesday nights in June for a 5-week small group study on how unlikely friendships at the margins, with all of their tensions and ambiguities, can actually enhance our spirituality and those we befriend.

Using the book, *Friendship at the Margins*, we will discuss the importance of friendships and relationships, the ways that friendship is connected to what God calls us to be in the world, and what friendship has to do with social justice. Through group discussion, stories, and prayer, we will not only look at the theme of friendship, but we will gain new friends along the way. All are welcome.


Is Joy from Within? Do You have Joy?

ALIX OLSON



Alix Olson is an internationally touring folk poet and progressive queer artist-activist. Since winning 1998's National Poetry Slam with her New York City team and 1999's OutWrite LGBT Slam, Alix has co-authored *Burning Down the House*, published two books of poetry, produced two spoken word CD's and an award-winning documentary, and has had her work placed in dozens of anthologies and compilations. Olson was voted 2004 OutMusician of the Year (OutMusic) for best contributions to the artist-activist field, and was a triple nominee for the 2002 OUTMusic Awards. In June 2003, Alix (along with Margaret Cho and Nobuko Oyabu) received the "Visionary Award" from the DC Rape Crisis Center for her "exceptional commitment to the promotion of social justice." Past honorees include Gloria Steinem, Tori Amos, Patricia Ireland and Sarah Jones. Olson has also received a New York Foundation for the Arts fellowship and a Barbara Deming grant. Before making a donation, please wash clothes as we do not have laundry facilities on site. Clothes may be dropped off outside Activities Building Room #110 on Sundays.


CARE FOR OUR ENVIRONMENT


