Call to Experience

One traditional element of worship is known as the Call To Worship, a practice that intentionally invites us to come into the presence of God. For the next 8 weeks we will intentionally call ourselves to experience the presence of God.

The "Jesus Prayer" shared today as our Call to Experience is from The New Zealand Book of Common Prayer. Completed in the late 1980s as the Anglican prayer book for the province of Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia, it holds closely to the Book of Common Prayer while managing to include Maori texts in an integrated way that has steadily grown in popularity throughout the world-wide Anglican communion.

Resurrection MCC is a Christian church that follows God's call to justice for all people. 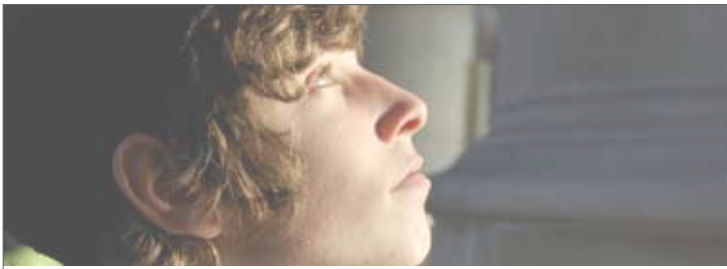

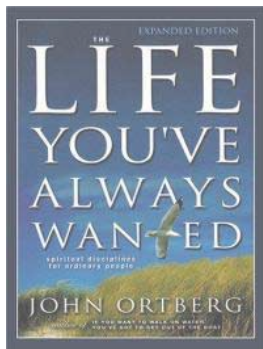

We are on track with our ministry goals but are experiencing the strain of the typical "summer dip" in our giving. Our church's cash reserves have dropped rapidly in just the past couple of months even while our worship attendance and ministry programming have grown. Unless giving rebounds, we will soon be forced to significantly reduce the amount of worship, hospitality, transformation, and mission our church can provide. 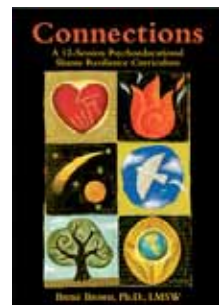
