Lift Every Voice and Sing

This hymn is known as the African American National Anthem. It places emphasis on the history of people of African descent, inclusive of their many triumphs and struggles.

This great song is known across the world, but the history behind the song's creation and first performance is often unknown.

Publicly performed first as a poem as part of a celebration of Lincoln's Birthday on February 12, 1900 by 500 schoolchildren at the segregated Stanton School in Jacksonville, Florida.

Principal James Weldon Johnson wrote the words to introduce its honored guest, Booker T. Washington. The poem was later set to music by Mr. Johnson's brother, John, in 1905.

Singing this song quickly became a way for African Americans to demonstrate their patriotism and hope for the future.

Resurrection MCC is a Christian church that follows God's call to justice for all people. We build on a rich history of social justice for, and on behalf of, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer people. Since its founding in 1968, Metropolitan Community Churches have been at the vanguard of civil and human rights movements as an international advocate for vulnerable people in places where religious orthodoxy, sexism, transphobia and homophobia can result in violence and death. As I come to the end of my Consulting Pastor work with you, I want to remind you of the blessing we recited together when we began this journey six months ago: "God who began a good work in you, will be faithful to complete it." (Phil 1:6) We listened to the story of Caleb who faced a defining moment in his life as he, along with other leaders within

the community of Israel, were sent to the land that God had promised them. Their task was to report the condition of the land. The report came back that the land was even better than they could have ever imagined, but so were the challenges to claiming the land as their own. During my time with you, I have been honored to model the role of Senior Pastor and join my voice with Caleb who cried out "We can do it!"

I believe the work that you called me to lead has calmed the waters of uncertainty and moved you into a place of hope. Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to join you on this trapeze of "in between time" and "hang in space" with you. Over the last six months we have sat together to listen for lessons to be learned, we have lifted our hearts and voices in powerful worship, we have searched our spiritual location so we can engage in our spiritual life with renewed focus, and we have taken the initial steps to discern God's vision for this great community called Resurrection MCC.

Emotions in times like these ranges from terror, silence, anticipation, wonder, flight, freedom, fear and hope in this moment before the next new thing that God has for us swings into position for us to grab hold. With your Pastoral Search Committee in place, and your Board and Staff prepared to lead, I believe I can grab hold of the bar in front of me with great confidence. African Americans face the most severe burden of HIV of all racial/ethnic groups in the United States. Despite representing only 14% of the U.S. population in 2009, African Americans accounted for 44% of all new HIV infections in that year. Compared with members of other races and ethnicities, African Americans account for a higher proportion of HIV infections at all stages of disease-from new infections to deaths.

Nearly 25,000 infections are estimated to occur each year in African American youth. More than one-third (38 percent) are among young people ages 13 to 29.

New infections among young African American males ages 13 to 29 is seven times as high as that of young Caucasian males and three times as high as that of young Hispanic males.

Young African American gay/bisexual men are especially hard-hit, comprising more than three-quarters of new infections among young African American men and accounting for more infections than any other racial/ethnic group of men who have sex with men.

Approximately 1 in 5 adults and adolescents in the U.S. living with HIV are unaware of their HIV status. This translates to approximately 116,750 persons in the African American community. Late diagnosis of HIV infection is common, which creates missed opportunities to obtain early medical care and prevent transmission to others. The sooner an individual is diagnosed and linked to appropriate care, the better the outcome.







We know that churches often get stuck at certain predictable plateaus and that the only way for them to move forward is by making specific changes which affect the role of the Pastor, the necessity for multiple Staffing, the way the Board of Directors functions, the way Programming is done, the style and content of Worship, and what Facilities are needed. 


