The Wizard of OZ

This American Fable has captured our imagination in many forms: The Wiz, Wicked, The Wizard of Oz and other variations.

The original book by Frank Baum was published in 1900 and first made into a movie in 1939.

Many know what it is to long for a "somewhere over the rainbow" where there is a place for everyone. This timeless story of our human journey - seeking, wandering, meeting others on the way, discovering what's real together - calls us to the spiritual truth that we can find within us the very thing we believed we lack ...

Wicked

The Life and Times of the Wicked Witch of the West is a parallel novel based on L. Frank Baum's classic tale of Oz. Centering on Elphaba, the misunderstood, smart, and fiery girl of emerald-green skin who grows up to become the notorious Wicked Witch of the West, the mythical story explores what

it really is to be "Wicked": are good intentions with bad results are the same as bad intentions with bad results?

Wicked: The Untold Story of the Witches of Oz is a musical with music and lyrics by Stephen Schwartz, based on the 1995 Gregory Maguire novel. The original Broadway production won three Tony Awards while its cast album received a Grammy Award. Wicked is the 12th longest-running Broadway show in history.
