Enter the Story: Elijah

Following Solomon's reign 930 BC, the kingdom divided into a northern kingdom—Israel, ruled by Jeroboam, and a southern kingdom—Judah, ruled by Rehoboam). The two kingdoms were often at war with one another. Between 875-848 BC, Elijah emerged as the prophet King Ahab called "you troubler of Israel." Elijah spoke up and fought against the prophets of Asherah and Baal who found a home in the northern kingdom of Israel through Queen Jezebel and King Ahab.

In a dramatic showdown, Elijah calls down 'fire from heaven' to destroy the other prophets and then runs away in fear for his life.

But God found Elijah, here we enter the story...

Communion

As we gather, break bread, and tell stories of hope through prayer, song and ritual in the practice we call "communion," we bear witness that "Life is stronger than death. People can change with God's help. And God is worthy of our thanks and praise." 
