Community



A LIFE OF ENOUGH: For Ourselves, For Our Church, For The World

Today, we will be gathering the financial commitments you have made to advance God's work through Resurrection MCC. This season we continue to celebrate our Summer commitments that have already taken us 51% of the way to our goal. And we continue to invite everyone to be in the journey of generosity from just starting off -- to tithing 10% -- into even greater abundance.

Specifically, if we already have a commitment based on a percentage of our income we are asked to increase that commitment by 1-2% of our gross income. If I currently give 5% that increases my commitment to 6-7% of my income. Some respondents this Summer moved from 10% to 12%. And also specifically, if we haven't made a consistent commitment, we are asked to calculate what starting at 5% of our income would be and making a first step to achieve that goal. On the back of our commitment cards is a helpful graph to financial gifts by percentage of income. This is a journey for everyone - one step at a time.
