Epiphany

Epiphany, derived from the Greek word epiphaneia, means "appearing" or "manifestation" and celebrates the showing, the "being seen" of Christ, the Son of God, at his birth, at his baptism, and at his transfiguration. All are events of disclosure! In the fourth century Epiphany was characterized as the loftiest of the Christian festivals. On January 5 & 6, every Christian house was decorated with wreaths, perhaps the very beginning of Christmas decorations. On the night of January 5, Jesus' birth, the adoration of the shepherds and the appearance of the star were celebrated. The next day, January 6, was dedicated to the adoration of the magi and the baptism of Jesus.

Revelation of the Magi

The first reading is an English translation of an apocryphal writing titled, Revelation of the Magi. The earliest existence is believed to have been between the 4th and 5th century, but there exists actual evidence of its existence in the 6th century. Brent Landau's translation was released in the book Revelation of the Magi: Lost Tale of the Wise Men's Journey to Bethlehem, First English Translation of Forgotten Ancient Manuscript in 2010.

This story of the People that traveled to worship and praise the child is inclusive of people from many different lands and does not require a conversion experience. What happens when we recognize that Jesus comes into our world in unexpected ways and to those deemed by society as inappropriate. Can our unconventional history tell the story of the Christ child come into the world?

And those books of hidden mysteries were placed on the Mountain of Victories in the east of Shir, our country, in a cave, the Cave of Treasures of the Mysteries of the Life of Silence. The Grief Recovery Method: The Action Program for Moving Beyond Loss

A 7-Week Grief Recovery Group with
Larry Leutwyler at Resurrection MCC

Simply defined, grief is the normal and natural reaction to significant emotional loss of any kind. The range of emotions associated with grief is as varied as there are people and personalities. Grief is individual and unique. As every relationship is unique, so are the feelings and thoughts each person will have about the relationship that has been altered by death, divorce, or for other reasons. Recovery from loss is accomplished by discovering and completing all of the undelivered communications that accrue in relationships. We are all advised to “Let Go,” and “Move On,” after losses of all kinds. Most of us would do that if we knew how.

The Grief Recovery Method® Outreach Program provides the action choices that help people move beyond the pain caused by loss. It is a seven-week program which creates a safe environment in which to look at old beliefs about dealing with loss; to look at what losses have affected your life; and to take new actions which lead to completion of the pain attached to one of those losses.

The Grief Recovery Method® Outreach Program is not an occasional, drop-in group. For the safety and success of all participants, commitment and attendance are essential. The fee for the program is \$100.00. (Scholarships are available)

The Grief Recovery Method® Outreach Program is led by Chaplain Larry Leutwyler, who has been trained and certified by The Grief Recovery Institute® and is currently on staff with Bering Support Network.

Register: \$50 deposit to register before Sunday, January 5. Balance due by first class. Minimum of 6 pre-registered participants. Maximum of 12. Confirmation of minimum registration achieved sent to all participants on Monday, January 6.



