"I feel sorry for anybody that could let hate wrap them up. Ain't no such thing as I can hate anybody and hope to see God's face."

– Fannie Lou Hamer

In the summer of 1962, Hamer made a life-changing decision to attend a protest meeting. She met civil rights activists there who were there to encourage African Americans to register to vote. On August 31, 1962, she traveled with 17 others to the county courthouse in Indianola to accomplish this goal. They were unsuccessful.

Hamer dedicated her life to the fight for civil rights, working for the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, a mostly African-American group of students who engaged in acts of civil disobedience to fight racial segregation and injustice in the South. These acts often were met with violent responses. Hamer was beaten so badly that she suffered permanent kidney damage at the hands of the police. In 1964, Hamer helped found the Mississippi Freedom Democratic Party, which was established in opposition to her state's all-white delegation to

that year's Democratic convention. She brought the civil rights struggle in Mississippi to the attention of the entire nation during a televised session at the convention.

This included work on issues of human rights, welfare, poverty, hunger, health care, violence, civil rights, the environment, and issues involving women and children.

He currently serves on the MCC Global Justice Institute's Public Policy Team and served as the Program Coordinator for the 2011 MCC People of African Descent Conference. Rev. DeWayne lives in Minneapolis with his husband, Kareem, and their dog, Dmitri.


