Black History Month

Ella Jo Baker

"This may only be a dream of mine, but I think it can be made real." Ella Jo Baker

Ella Baker heard the stories of slavery first hand at the feet of her grandmother and decided then that she would go the extra mile for justice. In 1940, Baker began her involvement with the NAACP. She worked as a field secretary and then served as director of branches from 1943 until 1946.

In 1957, Baker moved to Atlanta to organize Martin Luther King's new organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC). She also ran a voter registration campaign called the Crusade for Citizenship. Baker stayed at SCLC for two years although she disagreed with its policy of strong central leadership over grass-roots organization, saying "strong people don't need strong leaders. She believed that ordinary people must be empowered to demand justice.

Baker left the SCLC after the Greensboro sit-ins. She wanted to help the new student activists and organized a meeting at Shaw University for the student leaders of the sit-ins in April 1960. From that meeting Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) was born.

Rev. Héctor's pastoral presence and open spirit help him not only to hear but empathize with marginalized sisters and brothers across Iberoamerica.

His ability to communicate complex theological concepts and God's unconditional love has allowed him to rapidly develop new groups in different countries.

Excerpts from, *Jesus' Third Way*
by Walter Wink

Many otherwise devout Christians simply dismiss Jesus' teachings about nonviolence out of hand as impractical idealism. And with good reason. "Turn the other cheek" has come to imply a passive, doormat-like quality that has made the Christian way seem cowardly and complicit in the face of injustice.

Jesus never displayed that kind of passivity.

Jesus is not telling us to submit to evil, but to refuse to oppose it on its own terms. We are not to let the opponent dictate the methods of our opposition. Jesus is urging us to transcend both passivity and violence by finding a third way, one that is at once assertive and yet nonviolent.


