## Searching for Sunday

Like millions of her millennial peers, Rachel Held Evans didn't want to go to church anymore. The hypocrisy, the politics, the gargantuan building budgets, the scandals--church culture seemed so far removed from Jesus. Yet, despite her cynicism and misgivings, something kept drawing her back to church. And so she set out on a journey to understand church and to find her place in it.

Thus we will explore Searching for Sunday through the lens of the sacraments. Evans says the sacraments are the tent pegs anchoring her little tabernacle of a story to the ground. She chose them because they have something of a universal quality, for even in churches that are not expressly sacramental, the truths of the sacraments are generally shared.

### *Searching for Sunday*, by Rachel Held Evans

We are made of stardust, the scientists say—the iron in our blood, the calcium in our bones, and the chlorine in our skin forged in the furnaces of ancient stars whose explosions scattered the elements across the galaxy. From the ashes grew new stars, and around one of them, a system of planets and asteroids and moons. A cluster of dust coalesced to form the earth, and life emerged from the detritus of eight-billion year-old deaths.






