Searching for Sunday

Like millions of her millennial peers, Rachel Held Evans didn't want to go to church anymore.

The hypocrisy, the politics, the gargantuan building budgets, the scandals--church culture seemed so far removed from Jesus. Yet, despite her cynicism and misgivings, something kept drawing her back to church. And so she set out on a journey to understand church and to find her place in it.

Thus we will explore Searching for Sunday through the lens of the sacraments. Evans says the sacraments are the tent pegs anchoring her little tabernacle of a story to the ground. She chose them because they have something of a universal quality, for even in churches that are not expressly sacramental, the truths of the sacraments are generally shared.

Searching for Sunday, by Rachel Held Evans

The first thing the world knew about Christians was that they ate together. At the beginning of each week they gathered—rich and poor, slaves and free, Jews and Gentiles, women and men—to celebrate the day the whole world changed, to toast to resurrection. While each community worshipped a bit differently, it appears most practiced communion by enjoying a full meal together, with special prayers of thanksgiving, or eucharisteo, for the bread and wine."They remembered Jesus with food, stories, laughter, tears, debate, discussion, and cleanup. They thanked God not only for the bread that came from the earth, but also for the Bread that came from heaven to nourish the whole world. According to church historians, the focus of these early communion services was not on Jesus' death, but rather on Jesus' friendship, his presence made palpable among his followers by the tastes, sounds, and smells he loved.
