Remembering Orlando

THOU SHALT NOT KILL! - This is the one year anniversary of the Pulse nightclub shooting in Orlando which occurred on June 12, 2016. This hateful act left 49 people dead and 53 wounded. There seems to be a trend towards mass killings fueled by hatred and greed. In Matthew, Chapter 5, verses 38 through 44, and 46 through 47, Jesus said "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you. If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? And if you greet only your family and friends, what are you doing more than others?"

Communion

As we gather, break bread, and tell stories of hope through prayer, song and ritual in the practice we call "communion," we bear witness that "Life is stronger than death. People can change with God's help. And God is worthy of our thanks and praise." All are welcome at the table: you do not need to be a member of this or any church to gather as God's children at the table of Life.

A brief blessing is offered with bread and unfermented juice, available to all. Gluten-free bread is offered at the far right; Spanish blessing offered at the far left.




