Among those threats and opportunities that we didn't anticipate, there are almost always better options than were contained in our original plans. The strategist in us needs to figure out what these better things are, and then manage our resources in order to nourish them.

Dear Friends,

Last Sunday, we began a new sermon series, "How Will You Measure Your Life?" I shared that I see in you a 100-fold believer. In the parable according to Matthew 13, we considered the seed that fell on good soil which produced 30, 60, and 100-fold. I have already seen our people being 100-fold in their time, talent, and treasure.

I asked you to make a personal commitment to accomplish 100 acts of lovingkindness during the next year, with each act being at least 10 minutes. Many of you have given many hours of lovingkindness recently in helping our church and families in response to Hurricane Harvey.

LOVE is one way to measure your life. I'm talking about the kind of love that calls us beyond ourselves in giving of time, talent, and treasure. Whether tearing out sheetrock and carpet, volunteering with our children, or supporting our 45th Anniversary "Love in Action" campaign, it is all generosity growing from love.

Each Fall, we intentionally ask you to pray for our congregation's financial health and to discern how you can participate with your tithe over the next year. The biblical tithe of 10% is a real stretch for some, while others do much more. Some must make a plan over time to grow their giving to reach that goal. If you aren't there yet, try increasing last year's giving by 1-2%. If you haven't considered giving in this way, calculate 5% of your annual income as a starting point for your discernment. Your gift matters. Resurrection MCC matters.

Growing in generosity is a spiritual endeavor challenging us to trust that we do have enough and will have enough. Sometimes it can be difficult to trust. Recently, my family had to pay off our loan for our flooded car and then get a loan for a new car. I had to remind myself that we would be okay; that we would have enough. And, that we could still be generous. It took some prayer.

Estimate of Giving cards are available at the entrances to our worship space. We ask that you fill out this card and place it in the offering basket during worship on Commitment Sunday, October 15, at 9 or 11 am. If you would like to sign up for online, automated giving, you can do so at www.ResurrectionMCC.org. Consider how you will measure your life.


Thank you for all you already do in prayer, service, generosity, and love. I am thankful to be on this journey with you and I look forward to adding my commitment card with yours.






