We are committed to uplifting all people and standing with those who suffer under the weight of oppressive systems. We are guided by our commitment to global human rights.







Real Estate Update

At a Special Congregational Meeting on April 29th of this year with an 89% vote, you empowered your Board of Directors "to pursue the sale of a portion of RMCC property, including and not limited to the signing of binding legal documents and closing the sale, if the Board of Directors deems it is in the best interest of the congregation."

Since that time, we have been hard at work analyzing the very respectable offer we had received to purchase a portion of our property. After much deeper research, the Board elected to decline pursuing the letter of intent regarding that particular offer.

In the process of this experience, we have learned or verified several key points:

- We need 250+ parking spaces.
- We need to retain all of our current programming space (including the Activities Building).
- Houston's new floodway building requirements dictate that any significant new additions to our main building must be elevated approximately seven (7) feet, which is too costly for us at this time.
- Any new development option for a portion of our property must include shared parking with non-conflicting time usage (such as a building or buildings with parking underneath).

Based on these factors, your Board continues to explore alternatives that would best fit our congregation's needs and desires. Our property remains a valuable asset for us to maximize for ministry, and we take quite seriously the congregation's trust in empowering us to faithfully entertain viable options. We pledge to keep you apprised of our progress, even if it is only to let you know we have taken no definitive action.




