





The Three Questions

by Don Miguel Ruiz

By asking the question, “What is real?” we’re challenging what we think we know. Nothing is quite as we imagine it. Again, think of the brain as a mirror. If our hand reaches out to touch an object in the mirror, it would touch glass, not the thing whose image it reflects . . . Why is this important? Because, as we discovered earlier, we identify ourselves with the mind. We’re totally convinced we are the main character in the mind’s reality. Imagine what would happen if the reflection became aware of itself? This would probably create a huge disturbance. What if you realized you weren’t your thoughts and beliefs – that you weren’t even you?

If you acknowledge that your mind is a mirror reflection of what is real, and not a very accurate one, you can see that yours is only one interpretation of reality – one of more than seven billion individual interpretations. Then you can experiment.

Creating a Welcoming Space for Everyone

Resurrection MCC is committed to creating a positive environment for our congregation.


Sexual harassment is a form of sexual violence. Sexual harassment and sexual violence is any unwanted attention of a sexual nature, including:

- Remarks about appearance or personal life
- Unwanted flirtations or advances
- Offensive written or visual depictions like graffiti or degrading pictures
- Touching someone without their permission (groping, grabbing, hugging, petting, biting)
- Unwanted sexual demands, pressure, propositions, or requests for sexual activities
- Graphic comments about an individual's body or dress
- Verbal abuse, including sexual insults and name calling
- Rewards for granting sexual favors or the withholding of rewards for refusing to grant sexual favors
- Sexual assault, rape, and sexual violence

Many Resurrection MCC attendees create and build social and sexual relationships with one another. We want to remind you that if you are considering engaging in sexual relationships, consent is essential. Please be sure that all involved have similar expectations and engage in safe sexual practices. Free HIV & STD testing is provided by Fort Bend County Health Services on the first Sunday of each month from 10 am - 2 pm in the Gathering Place. Female and male condoms are available in our restrooms.

Resurrection MCC is proud to host a beautiful and diverse LGBTQ and allied community where vibrant diversity in sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression is welcome. It is all our responsibility to ensure that each member of our LGBTQ and ally family feels welcome and affirmed.

Thank you for your help in ensuring that Resurrection MCC is an environment where all worshippers feel safe, comfortable, and celebrated as members of our extended family. Finding the answers will open the door to the next stage in our spiritual development, and eventually lead us to our complete, truest selves.



We are excited to announce that during our flood recovery efforts, we have been updating the two multi-stall restrooms adjacent to the Foyer into all-gender restrooms. Those restrooms are available now.

Our core values of inclusion, community, spiritual transformation, and justice inform us as we seek to create safe and welcoming spaces that are fully accessible to all members of our church family. With these core values guiding

our decision, all-gender restrooms support individuals whose gender is different than assumed at birth, including transgender, non-binary, genderqueer, gender non-conforming, and genders that exist outside of the gender binary of strictly female and male. They are also especially helpful for people with disabilities, the elderly, and anyone else who might require assistance from someone of another gender, including parents who wish to accompany their children to the restroom.

In addition to these two multi-stall restrooms off the Foyer, single-stall restrooms are located adjacent to the Chapel, Foyer, Welcome Area, and Worship Arts Room.


